



#### THE KEY-BOARD.



By referring to the plan of our key-board on the opposite page it will be seen that we recognize the fact that nearly all professional typewriters are familiar with the standard or universal key-board. Our arrangement of the letters will enable them to readily operate the Franklin at sight

We have forty keys and eighty characters, with a space key in the centre. There is also a key that locks the carriage and secures the continuous printing of all capital letters.

The keys are of celluloid, handsome and durable, with inlaid characters, the letters being of white on black ground, and the characters in black on white ground.

By combining "c" and "/" the sign of c. (cents) can be made, making eighty-one characters on the Franklin.

### Type-Bar Mechanism


The engraving shows the simplicity of our type-bar device. Avoiding all wooden levers, toggle joints, and rocking-shaft movements, by the use of only SEVEN PARTS and a direct movement, we produce the same results as the complicated and delicate mechanism embraced in the from four-teen to twenty parts of the common type-bar machines. The direct movement without intervening parts between our type-bar and key-lever gives an action to the keys that produces a touch which is pronounced by experts to be the most positive and satisfactory of any typewriter in use.

### The Ribbon Feed.

Our ribbon arrangement is of the simplest construction, feeding horizontally across the type, and permitting the characters struck to be moved into plain sight of the operator as soon as printed. It is fed automatically, using both edges of the ribbon, making a great saving in the wear, one ribbon lasting nearly as long as two on the ordinary machines.

The ribbon attachment can be easily removed for mimeograph work.

#### THE CARRIAGE.



The quick response of the carriage to the action of the keys allows of the greatest speed in writing. The line spacing is done automatically as the carriage is pushed back for beginning a new line.

The space between the lines can be changed as desired. As the impressions of the type are made directly on the top of the platen roll, the best results for manifolding are obtained.

From six to ten copies can be made by using the regular platen, and from fifteen to twenty by using the hard platen. For ordinary use the regular platen is recommended.

#### THE PRINTING.

\* \* \* \*

The most serious objection to all type-bar machines is the liability of the alignment becoming imperfect after a few months' use. This objection is entirely overcome in the Franklin, each letter being governed by type-bar guides, which insures perfect register and alignment, and also takes up any wear of the only point of connection between the type bars and key levers.

Any type bar can be instantly removed without the aid of a screw-driver, and replaced in case of accident to the type, or an entire new set can be substituted in a few moments. Extra or special characters can be furnished if required.





